## **Vaccinate and Prevent**

- Children begin vaccinations for the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) starting at 9 years old
- The HPV vaccine (Gardasil) is approved through 45 years old. Speak to your provider to see if this is recommended for you.
- As of 2022, only 62% of adolescents received the recommended doses of the HPV vaccine <sup>3</sup>
