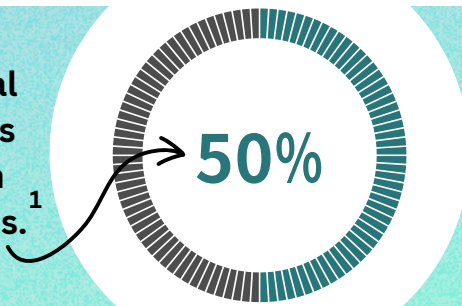

Cervical Cancer is one of *the most preventable* cancers due to vaccination and early treatment of pre-cancerous lesions through regular pap smear screening

Screening age starts at



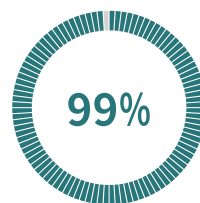
Percent of the total new cervical cancer cases that are in patients who have not been screened in the previous 5 years of their lives.¹

Vaccinate and Prevent

- ▶ Children begin vaccinations for the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) starting at 9 years old
- ▶ The HPV vaccine (Gardasil) is approved through 45 years old. Speak to your provider to see if this is recommended for you.
- ▶ As of 2022, only 62% of adolescents received the recommended doses of the HPV vaccine³

- ▶ The HPV vaccine has been shown in many studies to be safe and effective
