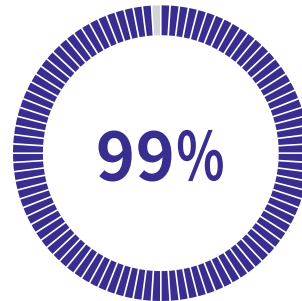
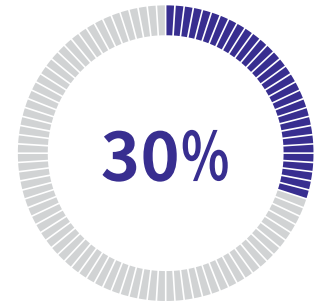


Why should you get a mammogram?

Poor nutrition

Smoking

Alcohol consumption

Early menstruation

Late menopause

Dense breast tissue

Lack of exercise

Genetics

Family history

Obesity

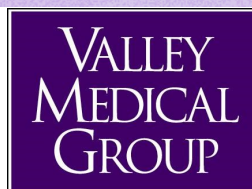
